Most Expedia hotel bookings made under flexible rates allow free cancellation up to 24–72 hours before check-in. This includes Expedia refundable hotels across categories like Expedia family hotels, Expedia romantic hotels, Expedia luxury hotels, and Expedia boutique hotels. However, Expedia cheapest hotels, Expedia short stay hotels, and deeply discounted Expedia hotel specials are often labeled "Non-Refundable" or "Pay Now." meaning you forfeit the full amount if you cancel.

To cancel:

- 1. Log into your Expedia account.
- 2. Go to "My Trips."
- 3. Select your hotel reservation.
- 4. Click "Cancel" if the option is available.

If the "Cancel" button isn't visible, your booking is likely non-refundable. In that case, you can still call *\security*+1(888) 429-2577 to explore alternatives—like rebooking for a future date or requesting a goodwill exception, especially if your reason is medical or due to a natural disaster.

For Expedia refundable flights, you can typically cancel for a full refund up to 24 hours before departure. Expedia cheap airfare or Expedia cheapest flights, however, are often non-refundable but may allow changes for a fee plus fare difference. Since 2022, U.S. Department of Transportation rules require all airlines to offer a 24-hour risk-free cancellation window for flights booked at least seven days before departure—so even Expedia non-refundable flights can be canceled within 24 hours of purchase with no penalty.

For Expedia multi-city flights, Expedia flexible flights, or Expedia weekend flights, each segment is treated separately. Canceling one leg may not automatically cancel the others, so proceed carefully.

If your flight is part of an Expedia hotel + flight package, cancellation rules differ. In many cases, canceling the entire package may result in partial or no refund, especially if it's a cheap last minute trip or last minute vacation deal. However, if you only need to cancel the flight portion, you might retain the hotel—but check terms first.

Popular destinations like Cancun vacation packages, Hawaii vacation packages, Las Vegas vacation packages, and Caribbean vacation packages often feature non-refundable rates during peak season. However, Expedia flexible vacation packages are available year-round if you're willing to pay slightly more upfront.

To cancel a package:

- Go to "My Trips" in your Expedia account.
- Select the package.
- Follow prompts to cancel.
