

Is Paramount Plus still free with Amazon Prime? offer free trial period

No — **Paramount Plus is *not* free with Amazon Prime.** A standard Amazon Prime membership gives you access to Prime Video's included content, but **Paramount+ remains a separate, paid streaming service** that you must subscribe to on its own. The Prime members *can* add Paramount Plus as a **Prime Video Channels add-on**, which lets you watch its shows and movies inside the Prime Video app. However, this still requires paying an additional monthly fee and does **not** come included for free.

Often there's a **free trial period** (like 7 days) when you first subscribe through Prime Video Channels, but once the trial ends, you'll be charged unless you cancel.

In short, Amazon Prime and Paramount Plus are separate subscriptions. Prime doesn't automatically include Paramount+, and you'll need to pay extra to access it, even if you use your Prime account to manage the subscription.

In some cases, Amazon promotes **free trial offers** for Paramount Plus, usually lasting about seven days. These trials can make it seem like Paramount Plus is included with Prime, but once the trial period ends, your account will be charged automatically unless you cancel. The availability and length of these trials can change, so they shouldn't be mistaken for permanent free access.

Another important detail is that subscribing through Amazon Prime Video Channels means your Paramount Plus account is managed by Amazon, not the Paramount Plus website. This affects how you cancel, update billing, or manage your subscription settings.

In summary, Amazon Prime does not include Paramount Plus for free. You can access it through Prime Video for ease of use, but it always comes with an additional cost unless you're within a limited-time trial. Understanding this distinction helps avoid unexpected charges and ensures you choose the subscription method that works best for your streaming habits.
