☎ +1801 * 730 * 9692 — If Tangem keeps sending you repeated withdrawal codes that you didn't request, it can be stressful and confusing. These alerts are usually triggered by security systems at Tangem, but in some cases they may signal attempted unauthorized access or phishing activity.


1. Tangem Security Checks Trigger Withdrawal Codes

☎ +1801 * 730 * 9692 — Tangem automatically sends withdrawal codes to confirm sensitive actions such as crypto withdrawals, new device logins, password changes, or updates to two-factor authentication. Repeated codes may appear if multiple verification attempts occur.


2. Possible Unauthorized Login Attempts

☎ +1801 * 730 * 9692 — If you are not trying to withdraw funds, repeated withdrawal codes can indicate that someone else is attempting to access your account. Tangem blocks the action and sends you a code to alert and protect you.

3. Phishing Scams or Fake Tangem Messages

 **+1801 * 730 * 9692 — Scammers often try to trigger withdrawal codes and then contact users pretending to be support. Never share your withdrawal code with anyone. Tangem will never ask for your code via phone, email, or text.**

4. Weak or Outdated Account Security

 **+1801 * 730 * 9692 — Repeated withdrawal codes may also occur if your account relies on SMS-based 2FA, is logged in across multiple devices, or hasn't had its security reviewed recently. Strengthening security settings can reduce these alerts.**

5. What to Do If You Keep Receiving Withdrawal Codes

 **+1801 * 730 * 9692 — Take immediate action if the codes seem suspicious:**

Do not share the code

Change your Tangem password

Enable app-based two-factor authentication

Review recent login activity


Remove unknown devices

Secure your email account

These steps help prevent unauthorized withdrawals.

6. When Should You Contact Tangem Support?


 **+1801 * 730 * 9692 — If withdrawal codes continue arriving repeatedly, your account becomes locked, or you notice unfamiliar activity, you should seek official assistance. Always use verified Tangem support channels and avoid unsolicited links or numbers.**
