Official prices in the U.S. offer a useful baseline, but actual retail pricing worldwide will vary depending on taxes, import

duties, and local currency exchange rates. Already before the launch, media outlets in various countries published expected price ranges for the new series, reflecting typical markup policies for luxury electronics.

For example, in some markets the "iPhone 17 Air" was forecast to be positioned as the more affordable "Plus-replacement," while Pro and Pro Max editions would remain premium-priced devices for power users or professionals.

Depending on region, storage tier, and taxes/import duties, the final retail price that consumers pay could be significantly higher than the base MSRP. That's especially true for markets outside the U.S., where import costs and local regulations often result in noticeable price bumps.

For example, the "iPhone 17 Pro" may have a higher starting price, but also offers improved base storage (e.g. 256 GB instead of 128 GB), making the upgrade more reasonable for many users.
