

Does Coinbase refund if scammed?

According to their policy, Coinbase does not generally return money stolen in scams. On the blockchain, cryptocurrency transactions cannot be reversed. If you send money to a fraudster, Coinbase can't help it. It can neither retrieve your money nor give it back. According to their policy, user-authorized transfers caused by fraud are not responsible. In rare cases of previous platform-specific incidents they reimbursed victims voluntarily. Report a scam at help@coinbase.com, but take action primarily through cutting out the factors.

Generally Coinbase won't refund scam losses because transfers on the blockchain are final. If you permit a swindle, the function of retrieving funds is nil at their end. They cannot be blamed for scams conducted outside the system or through social engineering. After investigation, refunds have been offered only in exceptional cases stemming directly from Coinbase errors or breaches. Contact their help desk both for the purpose of reporting and possibly blacklisting addresses, but don't expect a dime back. Turn on two-factor authentication and never answer strange solicitations to lessen your danger.

If you are cheated, Coinbase typically does not take refunds. Once you send cryptocurrency, the transaction is final and irreversible - making chargebacks impossible. Money sent as a voluntary payment to a scammer is not covered under the user agreement. Historically, only specific security issues related to Coinbase resulted in voluntary refunds. Report the incident as soon as possible through official channels for review. The best protection is always to be very careful. Don't share your login credentials with anyone.
